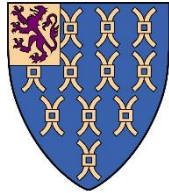
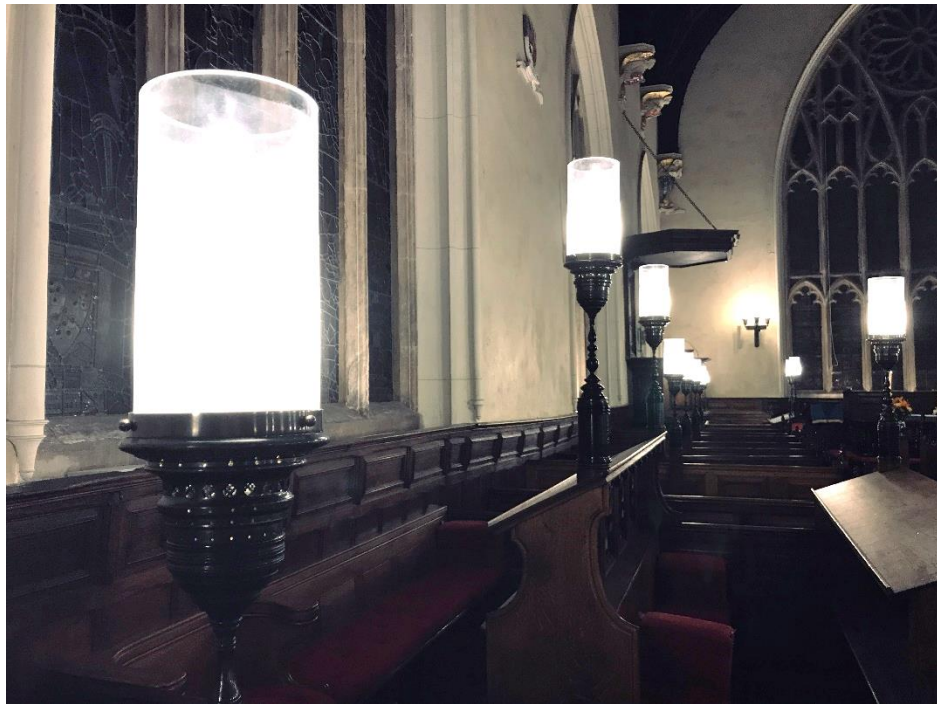

Why do we have a Chapel in the Inn?

Welcome to the Chapel for this Hilary Term which takes its name from Hilary of Poitiers, a Bishop in the 4th Century. His name comes from the Latin for happy or cheerful – and encompasses our hopes for 2020 and a new year.

What do we offer? Some find the Chapel a quiet space for reflection; for others the Undercroft and the stairway provide shelter; while others follow a more traditional path for weddings or christenings. Every Sunday in term there is a service at 11.30am – with coffee beforehand and a drink afterwards. All are welcome!

Music is a highlight: our professional choir provide the highest quality and a wide repertoire. The Royal Academy of Music and others perform at occasional lunchtime concerts.

Each term has special events – Rabbi Baroness Julia Neuberger joins us on January 19th and in March Dr Beatrice Groves of Trinity College Oxford will tell us more about John Donne, the 17th century poet, a student and then the Preacher of Lincoln's Inn. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 26th – look out for the special Lent leaflet and programme.

Our building is at the historic heart of the Inn. It is a significant renaissance Chapel with some rare Flemish stained glass as well as family memories in the Treasurers' shields. In the vestibule is a portrait of John Donne. His well-known lines, 'never send to know for whom the bell tolls: it tolls for thee', were inspired by his Christian faith and by the bell of the old chapel. The bell still tolls today – for services and to mark the death of a Bencher. Each time it reminds us of Donne's words: 'No man is an island entire of itself; every man is a piece of the continent, a part of the main. any man's death diminishes me.' It's the African insight, Ubuntu, that my life is inextricably bound up with yours - 'I am, because we are'.
