Hilary Term, Happiness and Anniversaries

Welcome to Chapel, actual and online, for this Hilary Term in the 600th year of the Black Books Anniversary. The term takes its name from Hilary of Poitiers, a Bishop in the 4th Century. His name comes from the Latin for happy or cheerful – encompassing the underlying hope in the Christian gospel still much needed by us all. Looking back to the 16th Century when the Inn's Black Books remind us of the effects of an earlier pandemic – the great plagues of the seventeenth century - then, as now, the Inn adapted amidst lives turned upside down and required periods of closure. Then, as now, the Christian message of hope amidst adversity; the belief that ultimately love and God can lead us through our fears and anxieties; the message of love thy neighbour has more importance than ever.

As term begins, we are very glad to mark the inauguration of the new Treasurer, Jonathan Crow QC, and the beginning of the Black Books Anniversary Year. Both of these events offer our first opportunity to livestream from Chapel. Further special events are on March 20th for our celebration of John Donne, the 17th century poet, student and then the Preacher of Lincoln's Inn, with Dr Beatrice Groves of Trinity College Oxford; Mothering Sunday; and Palm Sunday. Do also look out for the special Lent leaflet, as Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, March 2nd.

The Chapel lies at the spiritual heart of the Inn. It is a significant renaissance building with some rare Flemish stained glass as well as family memories in the Treasurers' shields. In the vestibule is a portrait of John Donne. His well-known lines, 'never send to know for whom the bell tolls: it tolls for thee', were inspired by his Christian faith and by the bell of the old chapel. The bell still tolls today – for services and to mark the death of a Bencher. Each time it reminds us of Donne's words: 'No man is an island entire of itself; every man is a piece of the continent, part pf the main.any man's death diminishes me. It is the African insight, Ubuntu, that my life is inextricably bound with yours – 'I am because we are'.
