# Michaelmas – A New Legal Year

Welcome to the Chapel – here to serve the whole community of the Inn, members, staff, visitors, and all those who live and work here. As we re-open after the summer break, our aim is to provide quiet amidst the clamour; music for the soul; stimulation for the intellect; support under pressure. Do join in events listed in this Calendar or contact us if we can assist in any way, members or residents – and a special welcome to anyone who is new this term.

Our building, at the historic heart of the Inn, is a significant renaissance Chapel. In the vestibule is a portrait of John Donne, the 17th century poet, a student and former Preacher of Lincoln's Inn. His well-known lines, 'never send to know for whom the bell tolls: it tolls for thee', were inspired by the bell of the old chapel. The bell still tolls today – for services and to mark the death of a Bencher. Each time it reminds us of Donne's words: 'No man is an island entire of itself; every man is a piece of the continent, a part of the main .... any man's death diminishes me.' It's the African insight, Ubuntu, that my life is inextricably bound up with yours - 'I am, because we are'. It's a reminder of how much we need each other and need to look out for each other today.

As term begins, consider joining us on 18 October for a unique event marking the Chapel's 400<sup>th</sup> Anniversary – a Celebratory Service and Dinner in the Great Hall. Hear from Professor Peter McCullough, of Lincoln College, Oxford, enjoy music from the choir and witness the dedication of our newly installed Treasurer's Shields (for the Treasurers of 2015 – 2022), by The Rt Revd Rose Hudson Wilkin, the Bishop of Dover and an Honorary Bencher. 
# "WHY MICHAELMAS?" THE FIRST SERVICE OF TERM
