Welcome to the Chapel – here to serve the whole community of the Inn, members, staff, visitors, and all those who live and work here. As we reopen after the summer break a special welcome to anyone who is new this term. Our aim is to provide quiet amidst the clamour; music for the soul; stimulation for the intellect; support under pressure. Do join in or contact us if we can assist in any way. As well as events listed in this Term Calendar – to which everyone is welcome – the Chapel and the Preacher are available for baptisms, marriages and memorial services.

Our building, at the historic heart of the Inn, is a significant renaissance Chapel. In the vestibule is a portrait of John Donne, the seventeenth century poet, a student and former Preacher of Lincoln's Inn. His wellknown lines, 'never send to know for whom the bell tolls: it tolls for thee', were inspired by the bell of the old chapel. The bell still tolls today – for services and to mark the death of a Bencher. Each time it reminds us of Donne's words: 'No man is an island entire of itself; every man is a piece of the continent, a part of the main any man's death diminishes me.' It's the African insight, Ubuntu, that my life is inextricably bound up with yours – 'I am, because we are'. It's a reminder of how much we need each other and need to look out for each other today.

As Michaelmas Term begins, consider joining us for the two Wigs and Mitres Sermons, one by The Rt Revd Lusa Nsenga-Ngoy, the Bishop of Willesden, and the other by Sir Robert Buckland KBE KC, the Third Church Estates Commissioner and a former Lord Chancellor.
