Hilary Term 2026

WELCOME to Chapel for this Hilary Term, which takes its name from Hilary of Poitiers, a bishop in the fourth century. His name comes from the Latin for happy or cheerful – encompassing the underlying hope in the Christian Gospel still so needed amidst the current turmoil of the world. Then, as now, the Christian message of hope amidst adversity – the belief that ultimately the love of God can lead us through our fears and anxieties; the message of love thy neighbour – has more importance than ever.

As Term begins, we are very glad to mark the Inauguration of Elspeth Talbot Rice KC as our 519th Treasurer. Celebrations continue on Sunday 18 January with the Epiphany Carol Service; in February look out for the special Thanksgiving in memory of those who have died; and in March, Philip West, Associate Professor of Early Modern English Literature at the University of Oxford, will speak at our celebration of John Donne, the seventeenth century poet, student and then the Preacher of Lincoln's Inn. At the end of Term, we celebrate Palm Sunday, with a Dramatic Reading of the Passion by members of the Inn. Lunch follows each of these. Do book early. Guests are very welcome.

Music in our worship plays a major part in Sunday services led by our excellent Chapel Choir and musicians. Finally, Lent begins early this year on 18 February, marked by two services for Ash Wednesday that day. Look out for the month of weekly Lent discussion groups which follow.

The Chapel is historically the spiritual heart of the Inn. It is a significant renaissance building (consecrated in 1623) with some rare Flemish stained glass as well as family memories in the Treasurers' shields. In the vestibule is a portrait of John Donne. His well-known lines, 'never send to know for whom the bell tolls: it tolls for thee', were inspired by his Christian faith and by the bell of the old chapel. The bell still tolls today – for services and to mark the death of a Bencher. Each time it reminds us of Donne's words: 'No man is an island entire of itself; every man is a piece of the continent, part of the main. ... any man's death diminishes me.'


