WELCOME to Chapel – here to serve the whole community of the Inn, members, staff, visitors, and those who live and work here. A special welcome to all newcomers. Our aim is to provide quiet amidst the clamour; music for the soul; stimulation for the intellect; support under pressure. Do contact us if we can assist in any way. As well as events this Term – to which everyone is welcome – the Chapel and the Preacher are available for baptisms, marriages and memorial services.

Our building, at the historic heart of the Inn, is a significant renaissance Chapel. Many windows contain the 'Treasurers' shields from over the centuries so we are very much a family chapel. The largest of these windows is currently in York for restoration. In the vestibule is a portrait of John Donne, the seventeenth century poet, a student and former Preacher of Lincoln's Inn. His well-known lines, 'never send to know for whom the bell tolls: it tolls for thee', were inspired by the bell of the old chapel. The bell still tolls today – for services and to mark the death of a Bencher. Each time it reminds us of Donne's words: 'No man is an island entire of itself; every man is a piece of the continent, a part of the main any man's death diminishes me.' It's the African insight, Ubuntu, that my life is inextricably bound up with yours – 'I am, because we are'. A reminder of our need to look out for each other today.

Do note the two Wigs and Mitres Sermons, by The Rt Revd John Inge, formerly Bishop of Worcester, and by The Rt Hon the Baroness Scotland of Asthall PC KC, former Attorney General, Advocate General, and General Secretary of the Commonwealth. Details of these and other special events – Remembrance Sunday and the Carol Services – follow in this Calendar.

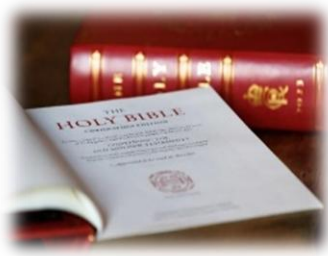

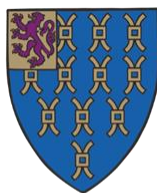
